Dear Friends and Supporters,

In 2021, Touchstone Mental Health deepened our work of providing person-centered services that foster hope, health, and well-being. This was possible, because our dedicated and resilient staff navigated the challenges of managing COVID outbreaks and workforce shortages. Despite these challenges, we provided housing, mental health treatment and community mental health services for 1,552 people.

We also continued our emphasis on reducing disparities and commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) at Touchstone. In the past year, we supported the activities of our staff led DEI committee, added employee affinity groups, and held agency wide training on race, racism and structural oppression.

Our Tobacco Free at Touchstone committee is progressing towards our goal of assisting our employees, clients, and visitors to live lives free of commercial tobacco use and exposure. This is consistent with our goal to support the health and safety of the communities we serve.

We were thrilled to find a new property for our Minneapolis Residential Program, after renting their present space for 30 years. Foundations, donors, and businesses generously supported our capital campaign to purchase and renovate the building. The new location, Two Rivers, offers a healing environment with 16 individual bedrooms, natural light, and is fully accessible.

We envision a world where people affected by a mental illness will flourish. We are grateful for our donors, partners, and supporters in helping to reach our vision.





Our Programs

Touchstone Mental Health assists individuals in their mental health recovery. Our services help people learn about their illness, improves their ability to manage their lives and reach their goals.

Behavioral Health Home and Care Coordination

Behavioral Health Home and Care Coordination are community programs which help individuals find community resources and coordinate physical and mental health care. Our staff work with individuals to create a plan that meets individual needs and preferences.

Case Management

Case Management connects people to medical, mental health, housing, financial, vocational, social and other necessary resources to meet their mental health needs and support their independence.

Housing Innovations

Housing Innovations helps people find and move into community housing and offers ongoing support to help people keep their housing. Household management, independent living supports, wellness education, social activities, and other home supports are available for people who are approved for waiver services.

Residential Treatment

Short-term residential treatment is designed to improve mental health stability, personal and emotional adjustment, self-sufficiency and community independence. Services are offered at Portland Place in Bloomington, Two Rivers in Minneapolis, and Lyric Lane in Fridley.

Intentional Communities

The Intentional Communities program provides inhome services to build social, community and housing management skills. Program members meet weekly as a "community" of peers who support each other in their mental health recovery.

Minnehaha Commons

Minnehaha Commons provides permanent housing for people ages 55 and older who have experienced homelessness. Touchstone offers 24-hour onsite services that includes counseling, nursing, housekeeping, service coordination, meal planning and prep, transportation assistance, tenancy supports, social activities, and linkages to community services. Minnehaha Commons is located in the Minneapolis Longfellow neighborhood.

Rising Cedar and New Hope Apartments

Rising Cedar and New Hope Apartments provides permanent housing with 24-hour on-site services that includes counseling, nursing, meals, housekeeping, social activities, service coordination, and linkages to community resources. Apartments are located in the Minneapolis Seward neighborhood and New Hope.

Fitness Center

The Fitness Center offers a variety of machines, weights, personalized fitness training, groups, and individual memberships. The Fitness Center is open to anyone in the community.
