In 2022, Touchstone Mental Health celebrated its 40th anniversary of providing services that foster hope, health and wellbeing for people living with a mental illness. We were excited to share our new brand with a logo that represents the diversity of people served and our work to guide them on their mental health journey. The vibrant colors and circle represent our community, continuous growth, and program innovations. We also launched a new website that highlights our service areas of Community Mental Health Services, Intensive Residential Treatment, and Community Housing Services.

We held an open house at Two Rivers Residential Treatment after completing building renovations on our new property. Two Rivers offers a healing environment with 16 individual bedrooms, gender neutral bathrooms, natural light, and is fully accessible.

The purchase and renovation of the new space wouldn't have been possible without community support for our capital campaign. We want to recognize the significant funding received from the Bentson Foundation, Otto Bremer Trust, and everyone who donated to our \$40,000 matching grant.

Our staff supported each other through the ongoing challenge of managing COVID outbreaks and restrictions in 2022. Our programs also experienced workforce shortages and difficulties hiring staff for open positions. Despite the challenges, our dedicated staff worked with 1,428 individuals, providing access to safe & affordable housing, as well as supporting their healthcare needs, connecting them with community resources, and promoting improved mental health stability.

Community Mental Health Services

Community Mental Health Services help people have the resources and services they need to improve their mental health stability, self-sufficiency, and support their health and wellness. Our services are provided in an individual's home or in the community. Touchstone Connections and Targeted Case Management helps people develop a person-centered plan, navigates the healthcare system and connects them with providers, and have the resources they need to meet their goals.

Intensive Residential Treatment Services

Residential Treatment offers 24-hour mental health services in a structured, supportive environment designed to improve mental health stability, increase personal and emotional skills, self-sufficiency, and independence. Services are available in three locations.





Community Housing Services

At Touchstone, we believe that everyone should have safe, affordable housing in the community of their choice. We offer programs that help people find housing and provide ongoing support so they can keep their housing. We also offer supportive housing with 24-hour onsite services in three locations.
